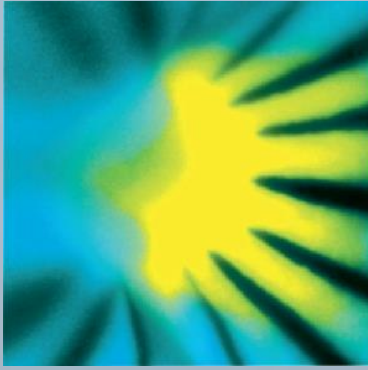
### New Phytologist next generation scientists

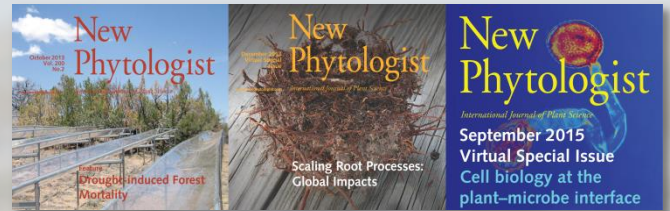
